	<b><u>Overarching Objective</u></b> <b>3. To take inspiration from the greats (classic and modern)</b> Describe the work of notable artists, artisans and designers. Use some of the ideas of artists studied to create pieces.	
Pupils should be taught: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products</li> <li>• to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination</li> <li>• to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space</li> <li>• about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.</li> </ul>	<b>1. To develop ideas</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Respond to ideas and starting points.</li> <li>• Explore ideas and collect visual information.</li> <li>• Explore different methods and materials as ideas develop.</li> </ul>
	<b>2. To master techniques:</b> <b><u>Drawing</u></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Draw lines of different sizes and thickness.</li> <li>• Colour (own work) neatly following the lines.</li> </ul>
	<b>2. To master techniques:</b> <b><u>Painting</u></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use thick and thin brushes.</li> <li>• Mix primary colours to make secondary.</li> </ul>
	<b>2. To master techniques:</b> <b><u>Collage</u></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use a combination of materials that are cut, torn and glued.</li> <li>• Mix materials to create texture.</li> </ul>
	<b>2. To master techniques:</b> <b><u>Print</u></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use repeating or overlapping shapes.</li> <li>• Mimic print from the environment (<i>e.g. wallpapers</i>).</li> <li>• Use objects to create prints (<i>e.g. fruit, vegetables or sponges</i>).</li> <li>• Press, roll, rub and stamp to make prints.</li> </ul>
	<b>2. To master techniques:</b> <b><u>Digital Media</u></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use a wide range of tools to create different textures, lines, tones, colours and shapes</li> </ul>
